



Class News

Kindy/Pre-Primary—In Room One, we have loved completing some craft activities and making gifts for Fathers Day last week. We have been working hard to learn some games for the Faction carnival and are looking forward to show our skills.

Year 1/2—In Room Three, we have had a go in Art at creating a 'progress drawing', using the elements of line. Each student was given a piece of A3 paper and they had to draw one type of line on it. The paper was then passed onto a friend, they had to draw another type of line. This continued until there were at least 10 different types of line on each page. Some of the different types of line included 'heartbeat', zigzag, bumpy, wavy, hatch, horizontal and vertical. When the lines were finished, the paper was returned to the original owner, who then had to use the lines to create their own picture. The students have created some amazing art work, using their skills and imagination.

Year 3/4—In Room Seven, we have wrapped up our studies of different short forms of poetry, and are working on incorporating one of our poems into a piece of artwork. We are also revisiting informational texts for the balance of the term. In Mathematics, we have been learning about different types of graphs such as column graphs, pictographs and pie graphs. In Health, we have been looking at different ways of resolving interpersonal conflicts.

Year 5/6—In Room Nine, we have been learning about measuring the area of triangles, using the formula half the base times height. We have been researching skeletons, and really enjoyed the phys ed lessons using frisbees. Our class is looking forward to presenting our dance for everyone in Week 10.

On Thursday 19 August the students had a free incursion during their science time with an environmentalist from SERCUL Macroinvertebrates. The students had lots of fun discovering the macroinvertebrates which are found in our rivers. All year levels used the microscopes and isoscopes to see the macro invertebrates in more detail than just using a magnifying glass or their normal vision. They learnt about how important these animals are to our environment.

How many serves of vegetables do children need?

Primary school aged children need between 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ serves of vegetables every day. A serve of vegetables is:

- 1 cup of raw vegetables
- ½ cup of frozen or cooked vegetables
- ½ cup of beans, peas or lentils
