You may pay by the following methods;

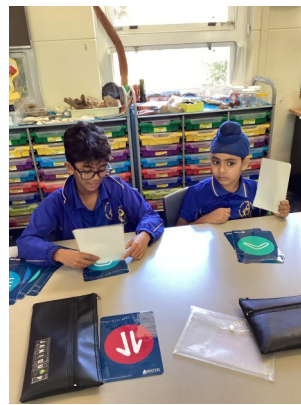
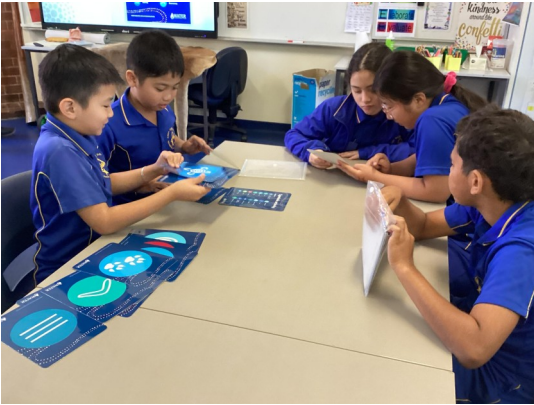


- **EFTPOS** (in the school office for your convenience).
