If at any time you wish to speak with me about your child's progress, please come and see me on a Wednesday or Thursday when I am at school.


Today the whole school (K to Yr 6) Took part in the Schools Clean-up day. We have been taking part in this activity for 12 years! We collected 3.995kg rubbish of considerably less than last year. The results are sent to Clean Up Australia. Hope fully next year we can improve on this and find even less rubbish.

Thank you to the parents who helped their classroom clean up the area as well.

We will be having after school science next term. There have been changes to this program. We will be running a Young Engineers' Club. The program will run for 8 weeks and each session will be 90 minutes long. There will be a price increase but it is for a longer session time and extended program. There will be 10 places to start and run on Thursdays. More details when I receive the information.

Waste Wise

We have been a Waste Wise school since 2009 and the school will continue the program in 2020.



The recycling station is outside Room 3. If you have any of the following objects, please send them in to refill the boxes- Ice cream containers, clean milk cartons, small card board rolls, tin foil plates and bubble wrap. The teachers and students use these items in mathematics, science, art and design technology.

Remember to bring in your old batteries for recycling and place in the container in the classroom. We are in a school competition to see which school can collect the most batteries. In 2018 we won but unfortunately it was not the case last year. Clayton View Primary won with 119.9 kg and Belmont Primary collected 89.8kg. We also recycle old mobile phones which can placed in a box outside Room 3. Please keep sending your old newspapers in and place them in the blue bins outside the bike shed. We are also recycling printer cartridges and there is a box outside room 3. We thank you for your support. There is also a clothing bin from the Good Samaritans near the double gate.

We collect the food scraps from the students crunch and sip, recess snacks and lunch which go in our compost bin for the vegetable garden.

We have been given the go ahead to paint our Classroom to make it fresh and improve our positive learning environment.


It is a great pleasure to teach the Year 5/6 class this year. Wishing everyone a fabulous month leading up to the next Holidays!







