Dear Parents/Caregivers,

With only two weeks of Term 1 to go, Christmas holidays are fast becoming distant memories!

NAPLAN—Our Year 3 & 5 students have been completing their NAPLAN tests this week under the supervision of Mrs Reiger. Other than the Year 3 Writing test, all tests are done electronically—a great opportunity to show our ICT skills, along with our understandings in the areas tested. Any student who was absent for any of the tests will have the opportunity to do catch up tests next week. I know that all students have given their best—and that's all we ask for.

HARMONY DAY: This will be celebrated next Thursday, 21st March. Students, staff and parents can either wear orange or dress in their National Costume. We will be creating a Harmony Tree and I invite parents to join their child's class to complete a hand leaf for our tree. Classes will be open at 10:15am for parents to join in with the activity with their child. Students will have morning tea at the normal time of 10:45am and are asked to bring a morning tea which represents their country. Due to health reasons, this will not be a sharing time. Parents are invited to stay for morning tea which will take place in the undercover area. Any other class activities / events will be sent out via Class Connect from the class teacher.

EASTER HAT Parade: Teachers will discuss this activity and requirements with their class and finished "works of art" will be paraded on Wednesday, 27th March at 9:00am in the Undercover area. I'm sure there will be some fantastic creations! The P&C will be drawing the Easter Raffle following the parade and tickets will be sent home soon. If you have any more Easter treats to contribute to the raffle, that would be greatly appreciated. The collection box is in the front office.

Morning Routines—we are still getting students here far to early in the morning. As noted previously, the gates will be open at 8:25am for students to go to their class, prepare for the day and catch up with their friends. We will also be asking for all students and parents to enter the classes via the hallway doors at the quadrangle side of the school. This will mean that the main entrance will not be used to go to classes in the morning. We are hoping that this will stop the congestion in the hallways that is starting to occur. Room 1 & 3 students will enter via the large gate area near Room 1; Room 4 students through the doorway near the staff room and Room 7 students through the doorway near the sports room.

Afternoon—the Meeting Room will be open for parents to sit and wait and get to know each other—this will stop the congestion on the pathways. There is no playing after school and gates will be locked by 3:20pm. Please let the school know if you will be late for pick up. Kindy students will still be picked up from the undercover area.
