Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I just read that it is only 7 weeks to Christmas—tell me it isn't so!!!

Swimming: A reminder that this starts next week for a two week period. Thanks to all parents who have paid for their child/ren to attend these lessons. In a land where being in a pool or at the beach dominates our summers, all children should be able to swim and have an understanding of life saving skills.

All students can come to school with their bathers under their school uniform, and a change of underwear in a separate bag. They will come back to school to change, so will only need to take a towel to the pool with them. They may also change their school shoes to thongs / crocs just prior to going to their lesson.

Lesson times are:

Group 1—Rms 3 & 7 & Yr 5's—they will leave school at 10:30am. Lesson time is 10:50-11:30am and be back at school by 11:45am.

Group 2—Rm 1 (PP only), Rm 4 and Yr 6's. They will leave school by 11:20am with their lesson from 11:35-12:15pm, and returning to school by 12:30pm.

Group 1 will have an early recess break, Group 2 their normal recess time. All groups will be back for our normal lunch break.



THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR THE COLOUR RUN

- Bring a white tee shirt or clothes you don't mind being stained!
- You will NEED to wear closed shoes and a hat for the event - these SHOES may get WET and DIRTY, so old shoes and an old hat may be best.
- Eye wear and a mask/scarf/bandanna may be worn by students who want to avoid the powder getting into their eyes and mouth bring your INHALER and SPACER if you are asthmatic
- □ LIGHT coloured HAIR may be stained with colour for up to a week after the run. To avoid this, you could apply coconut oil to the hair before the Colour Run or try to keep hair covered with your hat.
- Have a lowel/ change of clothes ready to sit on if you will be travelling home in a CAR to keep the MESS to a minimum!
- To help PRESERVE the colour in your tee shirt, soak your colour stained shirt in a mixture of water, salt and vinegar. This helps to make the colour powder 'lock' into the cotton and prevents the colour running. You can YouTube this for more information.

Sporting Schools

Our school has been fortunate to receive funding through the Sporting Schools program, enabling us to access coaching from accredited coaches in different sports.
