PARENT INFORMATION SESSIONS: These are planned for Week 3 of this term and teachers will send out a Connect notice as to when their meetings will be held. Until further notice re: COVID restrictions are received, these will be held after school and will be conducted in the new Meeting Room which is well-ventilated and has fans. These are information sessions only where teachers will outline their philosophies, class organisation, a little about themselves and answer any questions as a group. We will require you to sign in (teachers will have a registration sheet) and wear masks. Any parent who cannot attend the meetings will be forwarded a "pamphlet" covering all the above areas. Teachers will also inform parents when they can conduct one-on-one interviews as needed or requested by you.

PICK UP: Just a reminder that Kindy students will be coming to the gates at 2:55pm—this gives parents a bit of time to get your "little" one before the rest of the school comes out at 3:00pm. Week 5 Learning Adjustment Plans and Letters:

In Week 5 this term you may receive a Teaching and Learning Adjustment Letter or IEP for your child. Adjustments made by the classroom teacher enable students with additional learning and support needs better access to the year level curriculum.

This personalised approach to teaching and learning delivers rigorous, meaningful and dignified learning programs to the students here at Belmont Primary School.

If you receive one of these letters or plans please sign and return the slips that are attached within the time frames suggested as proof that you have read and are aware of the adjustments that are in place for your child in there classroom.

Students, parents, carers, teachers and schools that work together to develop tailored and personalised programs that help students get the most out of their school life are successful and effective places to be.

Teachers, as well as parents, are encouraged to call or book and appointments to discuss the plans or letters in place. This will ensure that the documents are collaborative, constantly evolving and responsive to our student needs.

PP On Entry Explained and Practice:

During weeks 3 to 6 of Term 1, teachers assess each Pre-primary student's skills and understandings of oral language, reading, writing and numeracy.

The teachers will conduct the assessment one-on-one with each child. The information provided enables the teacher to plan for the learning needs of every child, including those who may need additional support or extension.

Year 3 and 5 NAPLAN Explained and Practice:

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

Traffic Warden Required

There is an urgent need for Traffic Wardens to assist Belmont Primary School students. If any Parents/Grandparents are interested in becoming a Traffic Warden they can contact the Children's Crossings Unit direct on 6274 8731. An application pack can be sent to them. If they are successful in applying for the position and pass their training, they can be placed at your crossing, if it is one of our unmanned crossings only. It is also a paid position which does not affect a pension too much if employment is taken up. It would be highly recommended that any potential candidate on a pension contact Centrelink to have a chat. The current pay rate is around \$25.58 per hour - two hours per day/five days per week.

To become a Traffic Warden, we require the applicant have access to email, a full driver's license with access to a vehicle and be able to work the full 10 shifts per week - one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon. Any applicant signed up in this manner, who is a part of the school community, must reside within a 10km radius of their crossing/school.

Once the application has been submitted, it will commence the application process which involves a background check through WA Police Force Personal Security Vetting Unit. If they are supported they will be sent a medical assessment to take to their doctor which will need to be paid for by the applicant and reimbursed by the Children's Crossings Unit - up to \$70.00. Once they have passed the medical assessment they will be invited to attend State Traffic Operations in Midland for a training day which will last for about 4 – 5 hours. Thank you.
