Leaving 2022: To assist with our planning (staffing, class formation and budgets) could you please let us know if you are not returning to Belmont PS in 2022.



Next week is National Recycling Week. Our school will have an incursion Rubbish to Resource from SUEZ on 10 November.



SUEZ is the company now handling our collection of used batteries. Please bring in your used batteries and place in the class container.

Also if you have any other items that you would like to recycle please bring them to the Recycle Centre which is located outside room 3. We need clean washed milk cartons, large plastic lids, clean plastic bottles and wool.

We collect newspapers which are in the blue bins outside the bike cage, printer cartridges which are in a box outside room3 and clothing for the Good Samaritan bin located on the school grounds near waste bins.

Fact—The manufacture of one toothbrush produces 1.5 kilograms of waste.

Crunch&Sip®

Crunch&Sip® is a set break in class where children eat a piece of fruit or salad vegetable and sip water throughout the day. We ask parents and carers to supply a suitable snack and a drink bottle with water for our Crunch&Sip® breaks. Research has shown that drinking water and eating fruit and vegetables is essential for good health and can help children concentrate throughout the day.

Crunch&Sip* What foods can I pack for Crunch&Sip®? The Crunch&Sip[®] break is a time to introduce children to raw vegetables and fruit and encourage the water drinking habit. Fresh vegetables and fruit are the best choice. Please only send foods with a tick: Drinks Any drinks other than plain water including fruit or vegetable juice, fruit juice drink, fruit cordial, mineral waters, carbonated water All other foods not permitted include: Vegetables X Dips, including those that are vegetable based All fresh vegetables (eg celery, carrot sticks, broccoli bits etc.) Y 'Fruit' products (eg fruit leather, fruit roll-ups, fruit bars or similar) X Fruit jams, jellies, pies and cakes Fruit All fresh fruit (eg whole fruits, chopped melon etc.) X Fruit canned in syrup or jelly or with artificial sweeteners Fruit canned in water, juice or 'no added sugar' (eg peach slices) X Canned or processed vegetables

Dried fruit - please limit as it contains concentrated sugar and tends to cling to teeth, increasing risk of tooth decay

Water

Only plain water

- X Vegetable or potato crisps, hot potato chips X Vegetable pastries (pies, pasties, sausage rolls)
- X Vegetable cakes, fritters, quiches, breads or similar X Popcorn
