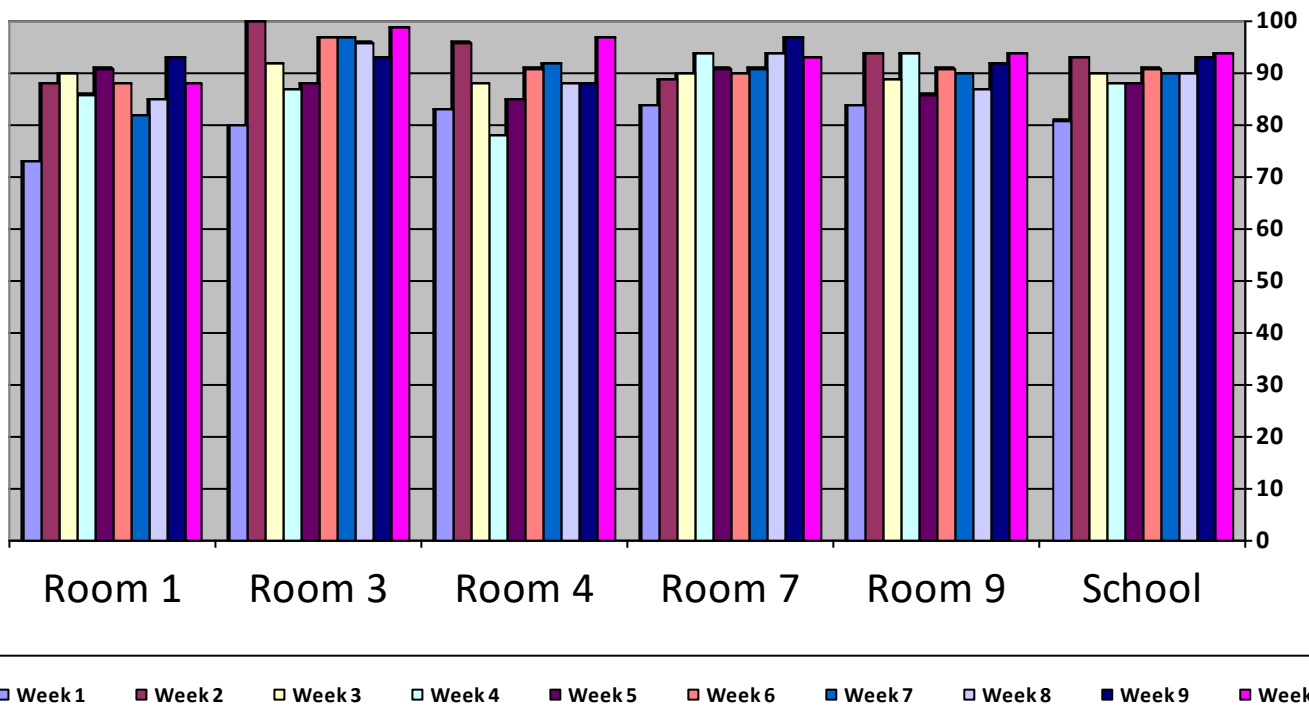

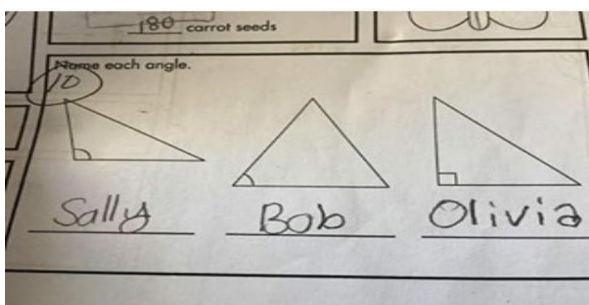
Term Planner: Our 4th Term planner has been given to your children today.

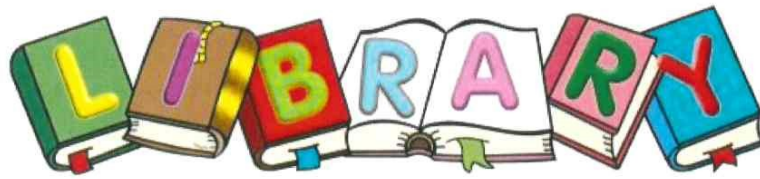

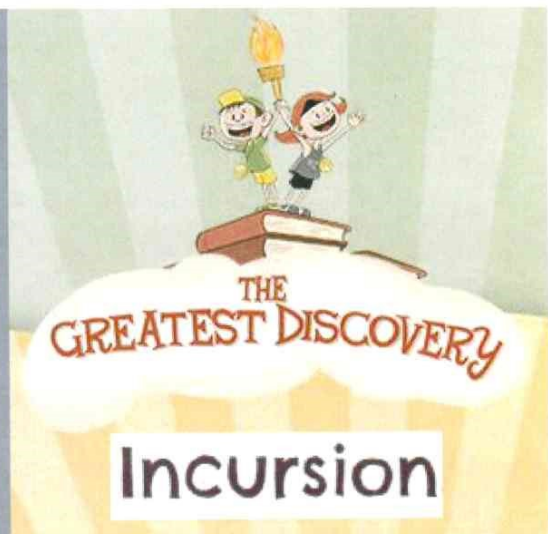
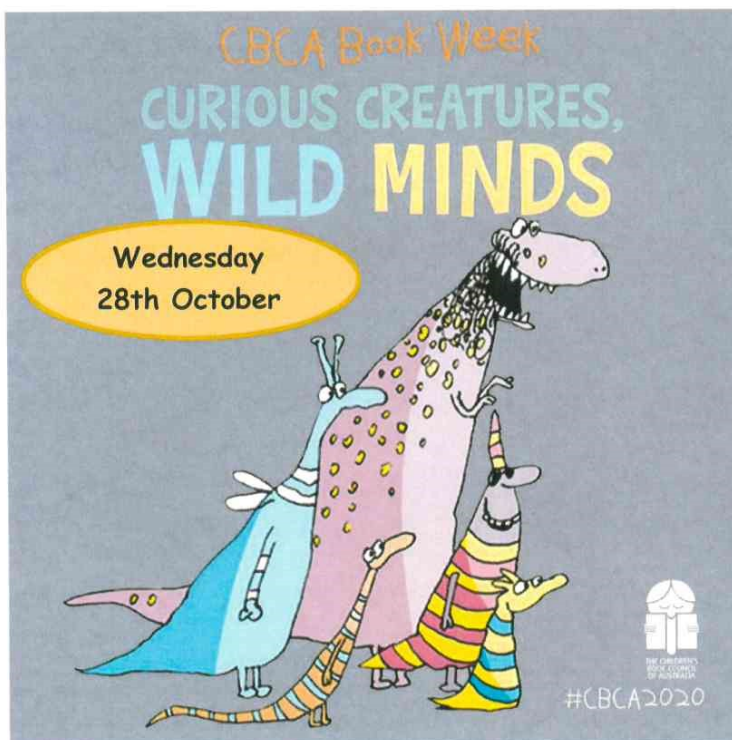

Science This Term

This has been a fantastic term with lots of science happening.



The PP/Year 1 looked at the “Dinosaurs or More”. We looked at the features of a dinosaur, where they lived, what they ate and their protection. The students loved designing and making their armour as if they were a dinosaur.

The Year 2/3 looked at “Watch it Grow”. The students looked at various animals to see how they grew and researched many animals and plants life cycles. We looked at animals that hatch from eggs and that are born alive. We had some mealworms to observe which they loved seeing.



We observed a bean plant germinate and grow. The Year 2's made a poster of the life cycle of an animal and the Year 3's a plant.

The Year 3/4 looked at “Among the Gum Tree” where the students looked at the life cycle of a bee and a gum tree. They also looked at how gum trees and bees and other animals rely on each other to survive. The students enjoyed observing the animals on a weekly basis on a gum tree in the school. They also enjoyed making a poster of the Life Cycle of a gum tree.



The Year 5/6 looked at “Rising Salt “where students looked at how changes in the environment affects different living things. They observed the effects of salinity on plants and over watering of plants. They designed an irrigation or a trough for a farm. The students also wrote a letter being an expert offering advice to a concerned farmer.



Science Week was another success with the students dressing up as scientists, lunch time fun activities supervised by the Year 5/6 students and our annual paper plane competition.



We had three Year 5 students attend the Belmont City College EPIC Science program for enrichment.

During the term twelve students have attended the Young Engineers Club after school on a Thursday. This has been very successful and the students have learnt and made many new things to do with engineering.

Term 3 has certainly been a big science term!!

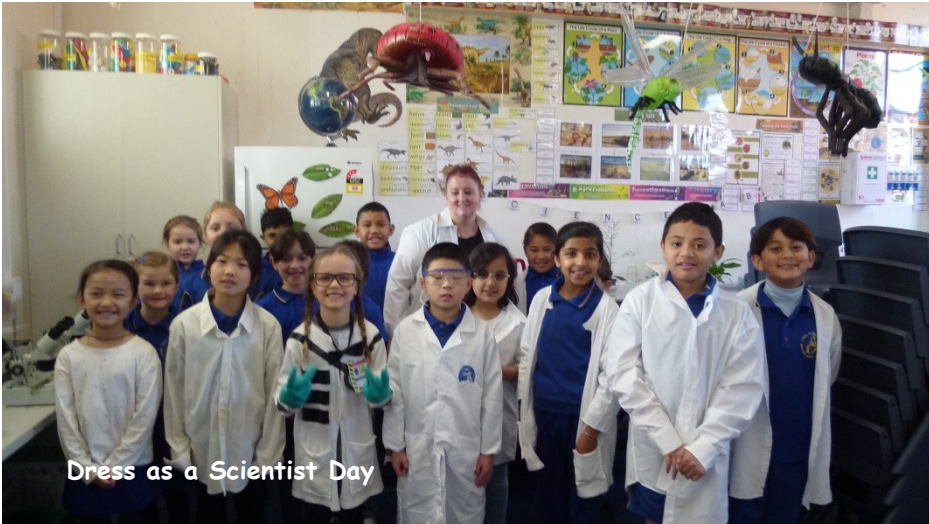

Cloverdale School Dental Clinic

We will be open for the Sept/Oct 2020 school holidays. Cloverdale Dental Clinic is open from **8am – 4pm** Monday to Friday. We are a free service and cater for school age children/teens from **Kindy & Pre-Primary from the year they turn 5 to the end of year 11 or their 17th Birthday, whichever occurs first.**

We are a Bachelor of Oral Health Final year placement clinic during university semesters. An experienced tutor oversees all check-ups and procedures.

It is not compulsory to enrol with the School Dental Service, if your children are having regular dental check-ups and treatment with their private family dentist, consider withdrawing from the school service. This will enable us to service those that are unable to access private dentistry. If circumstances change, you are welcome to re-enrol at any time.

If your address has changed/changes, please call us, as we send appointments to your home address, we also require current mobile phone numbers to send out text message reminders.

If your child has a toothache, please phone us on **9479 7222** between **8am-4pm**, if you have an emergency outside of work hours, please contact your family dentist or the **Emergency Service** on **1800 098 818**.
