Thank you to all parents who attended this assembly—it's always great to see parents support their children by attending these events—and the children are always eager to see their parents attend.

Over last week, Room 7 & Room 4 played hosts to our 6 Japanese students—and I'm pleased to say how much these students enjoyed their "taste" of being in a WA public school. I'm sure they will have plenty to share when they return to their own schools and classes.

We ask that all students wear the school uniform for these photos to show pride in our school.

On **uniforms**—it becomes more noticeable in winter the number of students who do not wear our school uniform. For winter, it is either the jackets and track pants from the uniform shop, or a Royal blue tracksuit from the local shops. Puffer jackets and other large jackets are not to be worn in the classrooms. We now have a stock of uniforms available, and orders can be left at the front office.

NAPLAN: I'm sure everyone has seen the news about NAPLAN results this year, across Australia, and changes that are being discussed. In our case, at Belmont Primary School, the following statement is made by the interpreters of data - "Results from very small cohorts can change substantially due to the recorded results of only one or two students. These data are generally more useful for understanding individual students than for drawing conclusions about cohort or school results."

In 2026, we had 8 Year 3 and 8 Year 5 students sit the NAPLAN tests which doesn't give us an accurate overall picture compared to schools which might have 40 students in each level. As a staff, we look at the overall areas of need and children who need extra support, and these become the focus for our future planning. One of our Business Plan Targets was for "Students' achievement in NAPLAN reading, writing, spelling, grammar & punctuation is at or above the average for like schools." We will be looking at our results at our next staff meeting, and I will then publish our findings for you all to look at and see how we went against that Target. From first impressions, our Year 3 students will need to be our future focus, but our Year 5 students performed well. It is also pleasing to note how our Year 7 (last year's Year 6 students) went in their NAPLAN, and their levels were above or like WA Public Schools. Well done! We will be looking at these results for discussion at our next School Council meeting on September 10th if you would like to be part of that discussion. Our Business Plan will be published on our School Website for you to look at and note the Targets we are aiming for in 2026.

Thank you to all parents / caregivers who completed the OSHC survey—20 responses received. I will be sending the responses into Central Office and will then inform you of the outcome.

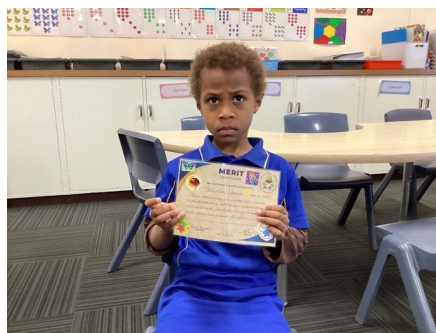

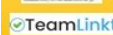

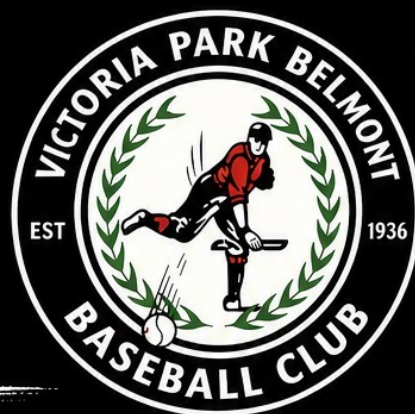
