Remember this is a one off test and we will use the data to highlight the areas in our programs which need to be developed further and also celebrate our successes. I’m sure that all students will do their best!

**Connect Parent Workshop:** In our aim to make communication more effective between the school and parents, we will be looking at the Connect App which parents can add to their phones. I will be conducting a Parent Workshop on Tuesday, 15th May from 2:00-3:00pm—in the school Library—for all parents to find out more about this App. All Welcome!

**School Council:** Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, 23rd May—starting at 1:30pm in the school library. Please forward any items for discussion to your parent representatives. We will be endorsing the School Budget and reviewing the Behaviour Management Policy.

**Buddy Benches:** Belmont Forum has kindly donated two benches to the school. These will be used as Buddy Benches—which means if a child is having problems in the playground, or needs some timeout, they will sit on the bench. The duty teacher, Chaplain, or another student will then know that there is a problem and go and have a chat with the student. These benches will need to be “sanded” down and painted before we start using them.....do we have any parent volunteers to help us with this little project?

**120th Year Celebrations:** This will be held on Friday, 8th June—starting with an Assembly which will be run by Room 4 students. As a staff we have discussed some activities, including—Dress as a pioneer; Bush dancing; marbles; knucklebones; library display of memorabilia; stories from the past; no waste lunches and a Community Morning Tea. If you have any other ideas, please let me know. This is a whole school event, so mark it on your calendar and hope to see you here!



**P&C Meeting:** The next meeting is planned for Tuesday, 29th May—starting at 1:30pm in Room 5. It would be great to see more new faces at these meetings—you don't have to take on any committee roles—just come and add your voice to help come up with ideas on making Belmont PS the “best little school” in Perth!

**After School:** As most of you are now aware, we are asking that all students and parents are off the school grounds by 3:15pm. School finishes at 3:00pm and this will give the children a short play time with their friends on the large play equipment (please remember that this is with parent supervision!) This will ensure that some of the incidents that we experienced last term do not occur on school grounds—and that all students leave school safely. If you have concerns with any behavioural issues, please come and discuss these with either myself, the Deputy or the class teacher. Parents who threaten staff, students or other parents on school grounds can be issued with a formal prohibition order which means you cannot enter the school grounds for 60 days, or a \$2 000 fine if the order is breached.

### Sunsmart



Students need to wear a hat that covers their ears, ie a legionnaire style, bucket/surfie style (6cm brim) or a broad-rimmed (7.5 brim) hat during all 4 terms of school. A cap is not a suitable covering and students will be asked to sit in the undercover area with the students who have no hat at all. A big thank you goes out to the students and staff who are wearing the correct hat. Well done, keep up the great effort.

Role modelling by parents, teachers, sport coaches and other adults has a positive influence on the sun protection habits of young people. So remember to lead by example and Slip! Slop! Slap! Seek! Slide! when outside.

### Crunch&Sip®

This program is continuing so make sure you have returned your water bottle so you can fill it up every day and bring in a piece

of fruit and/or vegetable to crunch on. Thank you for your continued support.

**Crunch&Sip**  
**Packing a healthy lunchbox**  
A lunchbox should contain about one third of a child's food for the day. Remember to also pack a water bottle and a Crunch&Sip® snack, preferably vegetables. For a healthy lunchbox pick an item from each of the key groups:

1. Vegetables as snacks or as a filling  
2. Fruit as snacks  
3. Bread & Cereals wholegrain or multi  
4. Dairy rich in calcium reduced fat milk, yoghurt, cheese or alternatives  
5. Meat and meat alternatives rich in protein  
6. Crunch&Sip® vegetables or fruit and a water bottle

## Community News

Looking for work or a career change? Can you see yourself working in a school? Schools are regularly hiring people for the following roles: Gardener, cleaner, administration, management, canteen or as education assistants.

Starting in July 2018, **North Metropolitan TAFE** are running a 1 semester course on the skills required to be a successful candidate for employment in a school. The course aids in preparation for entry into gardening, cleaning, administration, management, canteen and education assistant work.

We have had success supporting people to find work and the chances of gaining employment are strong. This course is suitable for existing gardeners, cleaners, administrators etc., and people looking to change career or people looking for work.

### The course includes:

- Training in skills specific to the role you are interested in e.g. gardening, cleaning and IT skills
- Work experience in a school or other organisation
- Help and support to find work

- Help accessing further training as required e.g. Certificate III in Education Support
- Development of your job application cover letter, resume and help with selection criteria

### Entry requirements:

- Strong work ethic
- Good oral and written communication
- Must be able to read procedures, safety sheets and chemical bottles
- Successful completion of an entry interview
- Working With Children Check and a Police Clearance

### Course details:

- 3 days per week - Starts Wednesday 18th July finishes Friday 30th November (17 weeks)
- Days - Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 9:15 until 2:45
- Cost - \$205 (total course fee for full 17 weeks) based in Leederville and on site
