Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Swimming Lessons: We had a fantastic increase in the number students who of attended swimming this year. Living in Australia, it is essential that children learn how to swim and develop basic water survival skills. I am aware that some children became sick during this 2 week period, and questions were raised about swimming times. I put in preferences every year, aiming for Term 4 so that the Pre-Primary children can attend, and hoping that the weather will be warmer. However, times are organised by the Swimming and Water Safety directorate in consultation with the pool centre, and taking into consideration the requests of other schools in our district. We have been fortunate that our allocations have not been during the winter months. allocations are also done months in advance. Our lessons for 2019 are planned for the end of 4th term. Thanks for your understanding in how these allocations are made.

Interschool Athletics Carnival—Friday, 2nd November. Congratulations to all students who were selected to represent Belmont PS and a special "thanks" to Mrs McDonald for her organisation for this event. Thanks, too, to all staff members who assisted on the day.

School Council Meetings: We had a very productive meeting Thursday, 1st November where Council members reviewed the Contributions and Charges for 2019. This letter will go home to all families with our next newsletter on the November. Instead of purchasing a workbook next year, we are currently researching an on-line Literacy program which will include Spelling, Reading, Grammar and Writing programs, linked to the West Australian curriculum. We will be looking for new parent members next year, so have a chat with one of our current parent representatives about what we do in Council meetings if you are interested. We hold our meetings during school time so that you don't have to worry about baby sitters, or coming out at night time.

Solution Fluency: If you have walked around the hallways, you might have noticed some work on Solution Fluency. This process follows the 6 D's (Define, Discover, Dream, Design, Deliver and Debrief) and students learn this process to critically solve problems (without teacher direction) Our first problem was "What do you feel is the most important problem in the world

today?" You will notice that the problems differ from year level—but they students' ideas on what they consider to be things that worry them the most. They then come up with their own solutions to solve these problems, based on what they research. The presentation of the project remains student focussed. The hardest part has been for teachers to stand on the side and not direct how they think it should be presented, or what they feel are the problems which need to be solved. Ask your children what their problems were and which one they chose to solve! I have been very impressed with the work I have seen so far! Well done, kids!

Another Couple of Reminders:

Arrival to School: I have noticed that some students are once again arriving to school before 8:00am. To date, I only have one parent request for their child to be here by 8:00am. Classes open at 8:30am and students should not arrive to school until 8:15am at the earliest to take part in the Breakfast Club—and to come straight to the Undercover Area with their school bags.

Thanks for your cooperation in leaving the school grounds by 3:15pm—greatly appreciated.

Last, but not least.....could I please ask that we return to wearing our official blue uniform. The 120 Celebration shirt was only for last term—it looks good, but isn't part of our School Uniform. I have noticed that there are still students wearing the Celebration Shirt to school.




